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

What We are Learning!

Preschool 4's: We reviewed the idea that an author can do both the writing and the illustrations. I told them that Leo liked doing things outside and watching animals. He wrote stories about that. I read <u>Little Blue and Little Yellow.</u> Preschool 3's: I read the story <u>Kindness Grows</u>. We talked about how kindness makes us strong and helps people who feel mad or angry. Kindergarten: We are learning about the author Eric Carle. He is an author and an illustrator. He liked using tissue and paint to do his illustrations. I read the story <u>The Tiny Seed.</u> We made a page about that book. 1st Grade: We started writing the report about Burrowing Owls. We looked back at what we high-lighted to answer the questions. 2nd Grade: They started writing their report about Loons. We are working on it together. They are using complete sentences. They also are using their information sheet to help answer the question's. 3rd Grade: We will be playing a genre match game next week. They have picked their realistic fiction book and have begun to read it. 4th Grade: They will be working on a reference sheet and matching a meaning to a reference book. 5/6 Grade: We will work on Informational writing next week.
