Notes from Mrs. M & the Library!

What we are learning 3/25/24!

PreK 4: I read the story The Story of the Leprechaun. I told them that this kind of book is called a legend, which means a story from a long time ago. People used to tell stories to their child and the story was passed down that way until someone wrote it down.

PreK 3: I read Wake me when it's Spring. It is about a bear and a mouse and how the mouse woke the bear up when spring was there.

Kindergarten: We learned the word sequence and what it means. It means to put things in order. We discussed that an author needs to put things in order when they write a story so the reader can understand the story better.

First Grade: We are doing a worksheet today, where they cut words and put the word by the correct spot on the paper.

Second Grade: We reviewed the genre of fairy tales. We finished the book reports today.

Third Grade: They finished their genre worksheet.

Fourth Grade: They finished the main idea bags and they received their bag with a list of 3 things that they need to put inside so their friends can guess what their main idea is.

Fifth/Sixth Grade: They played a game where they had to take advertisements and decide if they were first, second or third person.

Seventh/ Eighth Grade: They received a sheet that had a paragraph to which they needed to write a sentence about the summary of the paragraph.
