What we are learning!

PreK 4: They did a color poem of foods they would see on their thanksgiving table. I read the book <u>Bear Gives Thanks</u>. They learned the sign language for thanks and thanksgiving.

Kindergarten: We will begin another Jordy John story, <u>The Good Egg.</u> We will talk about the settings and the characters. They will retell the story. We will discuss how the eggs are different and how they are the same. If there is time I will read Turkey Trouble.

First Grade: They will work on things that the an author does. I will pass around a bag that has small things in it and they will tell a story from that bag.
