## Book Nook

Notes from Mrs. M & the Library!

### What we are learning 4/2/24!

- PreK 4:** I read the story The Little Leprechaun that loved the color yellow. He loved all the colors but his favorite color was yellow. He went to find gold at the end of the rainbow and got lost. Ask your child what he got when they found him.
- PreK 3:** I read When Spring comes. This book told them about all the things that change when spring comes. The end of the story also mentioned the next season that comes. We talked about how God gives us 4 seasons to have fun in.
- Kindergarten:** We reviewed the word sequence. We talked about the number of things that are in sequence. I read the story Swimmy and they had to put the story in sequence.
- First Grade:** We are learning the things that are on the spine of our books. These things are the call number, or the address of the book. The reading level of the book and the genre of the book.
- Second Grade:** We read an article about Humming birds. We read it first and then found things they thought were important about Humming birds and highlighted them.
- Third Grade:** We reviewed the genre worksheet. Then we learned about the dictionary as a reference book.
- Fourth Grade:** We guessed the main ideas from the children who returned them. They then learned how many things are considered reference information. We will work with the Atlas reference first.
- Fifth/Sixth Grade:** We went through the phrases that they put in first, second, and third person.
- Seventh/ Eighth Grade:** They did very well with those summaries. They got back their shark summary and a new summary about an octopus, for an assignment.
