Notes from Mrs. M & the Library!

#### What we are learning!

Prek 4: They did a color poem of foods they would see on their thanksgiving table. I read the book <u>Bear Gives</u> Thanks. They learned the sign language for thanks and thanksgiving.

Kindergarten: We will begin another Jordy John story, <u>The Good Egg</u>. We will talk about the settings and the characters. They will retell the story. We will discuss how the eggs are different and how they are the same. If there is time I will read <u>Turkey Trouble</u>.

First Grade: They will work on things that the an author does. I will pass around a bag that has small things in it and they will tell a story from that bag.

Second Grade: They will review where the table of contents is in the book and what type of book has a table of contents. Then they will learn about the index and where that is, plus what it helps with. They will also do a worksheet.

Third Grade: They are working on a tall tale book report. They will play a game to help them know what is the difference is between the 5 reasons author's write.

Fourth Grade: They will be finishing their encyclopedia unit by looking up a State and finding certain things about that State.

Fifth/Sixth Grade: They started to write their story on a computer. We went through some of the things I will be looking for the story. We reviewed what a hyperbole is and how important it is to the make up of a tall tale.

Seventh/ Eighth Grade: They finished their sections of the Dewey System and handed them in.
