What we are learning 3/20/24!

PreK 4: I read the book <u>Saint Patrick's Day</u>. I used this book to introduce Saint Patrick to the Preschool. The story is that Patrick was taken away from and sold into slavery in Ireland. This is how he learned about God. He used the shamrock to teach the Irish about God in the persons of the Trinity.

PreK 3: I read <u>St. Patrick's Day.</u> This is much simpler book to explain the story of St. Patrick

Kindergarten: We reviewed the <u>Ninja Red Riding</u> ninja moves. Today we compared the original story of <u>Little Red Riding Hood</u> to the story <u>Ninja Red Riding Hood</u>. We learned what things are the same or different.

First Grade: We are doing a worksheet today, where we need to color certain things with different colors.

Second Grade: We reviewed the genre of fairy tales. Then we wrote their first book report.

Third Grade: They finished their book report and handed them in. They will finish up with the work sheet for Genres.

Fourth Grade: They needed to finish up the main idea bags. They are almost done with them and then they will do their own main idea bag.

Fifth/Sixth Grade: They did a worksheet with point of view. They needed to find differences and similar things in the paragraphs them read. Then they needed to write a paragraph using one the different points of view.

Seventh/ Eighth Grade: They wrote a summary about a shark article. I reminded them that a summary is just the main points of the article in a complete sentence.
