### What We are Learning!

**Preschool 4's**: I read another Leo Lionni books. <u>A Color of His Own</u>. The chameleon in the story wants the color that is just one for him not all the other colors that the other animals have. At the end of the story he meets another chameleon and they change colors together. Preschool 3's: I read the story Llama, llama Bully goat. We talked about how the mean goat in the story didn't make good choices and his friends didn't like it. When he had to stop playing a recess he learned his friends liked his good choices better,

his good choices better, **Kindergarten:** We are learning about the author Eric Carle. He is an author and an illustrator. He liked using tissue and paint to do his illustrations. I read the story <u>The Very Busy Spider</u>. We made a page about that book. **1st Grade:** We started learning about the Tall Tale Genre. We learned that these types of stories were not written down. People made up big things about these real people called hyperbole. I read the story of <u>Pecos Bill</u>. Then we talked about it.

2nd Grade: They started learning about the Fairy Tale Genre. The stories were written down. They were mostly about rich queens and kings. We always learn some-thing from them. I read The Selfish Giant and The Twelve Dancing Princess.

**3rd Grade:** They learned that a fact always can be checked and will most likely have numbers in it. Opinion belongs to you, it is what you think and may not be someone else's opinion.

**4th Grade:** They learned a little about Poetry and that there is many kinds of poetry. We started with Acrostic poems. This is where you take the letters from a word and each letter starts the line of the poem.

5/6 Grade: They are reading their books and some of them have are taking notes on the chapters they have read. We talked about the topic sentence which tells the read what is in the paragraph. 7/8 Grade: They handed in their book jackets.


