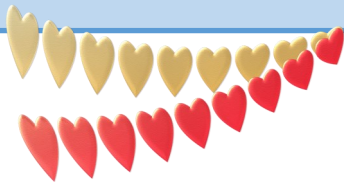

Notes from Mrs. M & the Library!

What we are learning 2/27/24!

PreK 4: I read the book Loads of Love. The theme of this book is that showing love isn't just for Valentines Day. When ever we are kind and helpful we are showing love.

PreK 3: I read Valentines are a way to say I love you.

Kindergarten: I read the story Ninja Red Riding Hood. We practiced our ninja moves. Then we went through the characters, setting, the hero, the villain, the problem and the solution.

First Grade: They did the physical and character traits for Grandmother.

Second Grade: They compared the character traits for Elizabeth and Prince Ronald.

Third Grade: They were told what the characteristics for science fiction are. Then they worked on another worksheet to match genres.

Fourth Grade: They picked their book for realistic fiction. Then they started to work main idea task cards.

Fifth/Sixth Grade: They did a worksheet on Point of view. It is called the Titanic. They needed to answer the author's viewpoint, how the text would be different if told from a survivor's point of view, and if they agreed or disagreed with the author's point of view.

Seventh/ Eighth Grade: They had a worksheet that had both summary and paraphrasing of a paragraph. They also find the main points. Then write both a summary and a paraphrasing piece.
