What We are Learning!

Preschool 4's: I read another Leo Lionni book. A Color of His Own. The chameleon in the story wants the color that is just one for him not all the other colors that the other animals have. At the end of the story he meets another chameleon and they change colors together. Preschool 3's: I read the story Llama, llama Bully goat. Kindergarten: We are learning about the author Eric
Carle. He is an author and an illustrator. He liked using

4th Grade: They learned a little about Poetry and that there is many kinds of poetry. We started with Acrostic poems. This is where you take the letters from a word and each letter starts the line of the poem.

5/6 Grade: They are reading their books and some of them have are taking notes on the chapters they have read. We talked about the topic sentence which tells the read what is in the paragraph.
